Northern Ireland Housing Trust Points Scheme

This file contains the points scheme used by the Northern Ireland Housing Trust to allocate its public sector houses from 1946 until the end of the 1960s. It was not subject to any significant criticism.

The scheme is included as an Appendix to the Northern Ireland Housing Trust's Annual Report for 1968.

APPENDIX (Points System.)

Applications are graded by awarding points under the following headings: Applications are graded by awarding points under the following headings:
(a) Overcrowding: The points to be given are obtained by ascertaining the minimum standard of accommodation required by the applicant, and subtracting from this number of rooms the number of rooms actually occupied, then multiply by 2, Minimum Standard:
